All activities and check-ins are located in the **Pryzbyla Student Center**, located diagonally right from the upper corner of the Basilica, near the large parking lot to the right of Caldwell Hall and behind McMahan Hall.

CUA has its own **Metro stop** ([Red Line, Brookland-CUA](#)) and is accessible by Metro from Washington Reagan Airport. Full map of the Metro system [available here](#).

Note: The Metro stop is behind the Pryzbyla Center toward Michigan Avenue, about 2 blocks' walk.

Meals

Catered meals for Sunday dinner, Monday dinner, and Tuesday lunch are included with full conference registration. For one-day registrations and exhibitors, tickets for these catered meals may be purchased separately on the registration form.

Other food options include:

- **Student Restaurant in Pryzbyla Center:** Meal tickets may be purchased when registering for the conference for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, or with cash at the door of the restaurant.
 - **Hours:** Open Saturday and Sunday, 8:30 a.m.-10:30 p.m. and Friday, 7:30 a.m.-1:00 a.m.. Mon.-Thursday, 7:30 a.m.-10:30 p.m. This is the meal option during the Pre-conference weekend.

- **Pryzbyla Food Court:** Open weekdays only, 11:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. Large selection of hot and cold foods. Pay at check out. See <http://cua.campusdish.com/Locations/PryzFoodCourt.aspx>
- **Starbucks**, Pryzbyla Center: Open 7:00 am-11:00 pm. Drinks and snacks.
- **Basilica Cafeteria:** Open Monday – Saturday, 7:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.; Sunday, 7:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Full meals available.
- **Local restaurant options:** there are a [number of nearby restaurants](#), coffee shops and cafes on Michigan Avenue between the Metro and 4th Street, within walking distance of CUA; downtown DC is also only a short Metro trip away on the Red Line (head toward Shady Grove). A good options for eating downtown include Chinatown (on the red line), but there are restaurants and cafés everywhere.

Nearby Attractions

People are encouraged to visit:

- [Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception](#) - immediately adjacent to CUA; there is a gift shop and scheduled guided tours
- [Saint John Paul II Shrine](#) - across the street from CUA at 3900 Harewood Road NE; there is a gift shop, a museum exhibit, and sacred art tours upon request

Note: on the weekends, a shuttle runs every 20 minutes from the Basilica to the John Paul II Shrine.

- [Franciscan Monastery](#), about a mile away at 1400 Quincy Street NE; there is a gift shop, guided tours of the church, an outdoor Rosary walk, and replicas of Holy Land and other sacred sites.
- [Brookland Arts Walk](#), between the metro station and Monroe Street NE; a pedestrian-only walk with galleries and studios; check ahead for store hours
