

# "How Can I Live Out My Call To Love?"

Join **Dr. Mary Beth Yount** and learn how to lead others in an exploration of a central question of the Love is Our Mission Preparatory Catechesis: "How can I live out my call to love?" The material from the first two chapters of the Preparatory Catechesis, "Created for Joy" and "The Mission of Love," sets out a deep theological anthropology, emphasizing that God loves us, made us to be loving, and is active in our lives. She will teach you how to use this catechetical document to teach others that God created us for a purpose - to receive and demonstrate God's love to others. If we are indeed partners with God in the mission of bringing all things to good, how does this inform the ways that we live our lives?

Tracing scripture and following the patterns of the Preparatory Catechesis, Dr. Yount will highlight the meaning of creation while integrating concepts such as incarnation, images of God, covenant, and redemption, so that catechists can do the same. This content is relevant to everyone, whether or not they are able to attend the World Meeting of Families-Philadelphia 2015.
